LEADERSHIP MEETING: In mid-July, Vestry, Commission Chairs, and committee members gathered to consider the future of St. Philip’s. With the help of Bishop Kirk Smith, they reviewed our current strengths and recommitted to those project areas we developed during the Mission Discernment process. The next day, our stewardship leaders worked with Canon Timothy Dombek while other working groups met with Terri Mathes from the Episcopal Church Foundation to set next steps for those Mission Discernment projects that are still in progress. The result? Inspiring new ideas and some old fashioned nuts-and-bolts. We’ll be updating you regularly on the progress of all these groups. Thanks to the hardworking ministry volunteers of St. Philip’s who gave their time and insights to this project.

MIGRANT FOOD PACKS NEXT SUNDAY: The Outreach Commission is preparing food packets to be distributed by the Center for Migrant Resources in Naco, Sonora, and Humanitarian Border Solutions, Bisbee. We will be collecting food **during Coffee Hour on August 8 and August 15.** Assembly of the food packets is scheduled for Sunday, August 15, in the Children’s Chapel starting at 10:15 a.m. We need: sports drink; pop top lid meat or tuna, protein bars, beef jerky; nuts, trail mix, dried fruit, chips, fig bars, or cookies in small packets; granola, power, or snack bars; applesauce, pudding, or fruit cup (with spoon); peanut butter or cheese filled crackers (small packets); bottled water. Your support is very much appreciated.

PLEASE KEEP PLEDGE CURRENT: Giving via offering baskets traditionally slows down in the summer with reduced attendance, yet expenses continue. Utility bills are up with the hot summer weather. During the 2010 year, your 17 cents has helped pay for our continuing Leadership Institute, which prepares Episcopal Hispanic/Latino for leadership in the Church and to equip them for possible vocations in the ministry of the Episcopal Church.

We hope to provide scholarships for up to 20 Hispanic/Latino kids this summer at the Diocese’s Chapel Rock.

A Hispanic Cursillo was scheduled for July 15-18 at the Franciscan Renewal Center with the assistance of Hispanic Cursillo teams from Los Angeles and Texas, but was canceled after the passage of SB1070.

Our Family Camp at Chapel Rock in August, which was previously held with the Sudanese Family Camp, has been so successful that we must divide this year!

The Program Group will also pay for mariachi music for the Christmas posadas in December.
